





SAMPLE PROBLEMS

The team's problem is to create and present a humorous performance depicting problem solving from the perspective of three different animals. The animals will help a stranger, help each other, and solve a problem that threatens the survival of all animals. During the performance, the animals will sing and dance. They will also show curiosity, sympathy, frustration, and joy.

The problem requires teams to design, build, and drive a vehicle that will travel a course where it will encounter three different situations. The vehicle will display a different human emotion for each encounter and one will cause it to travel in reverse. The team will create a theme for the presentation that incorporates the vehicle and the different emotions. The emphases will be on the technical risk-taking and creativity of the vehicle's engineering for travel and change of emotional appearance.

Learn the art of medieval swordplay using fully padded and safety-tested boffer swords, shields, arrows, and other gear! Play fun games like capture the flag, protect the castle, and zombie apocalypse! The classes will teach valuable lessons and skills through games, including swordplay technique, teamwork, discipline, honor, and even humility. Taught by Phil Ferguson, leader of The Wandering Swordsmen and founder of the boffer swordplay community in Asheville, who has been teaching youth swordplay for three years including Sundays at Carrier Park and at LEAF!



Phil Ferguson, the leader of The Wandering Swordsmen, started training in boffer swordplay in 2006, started the Asheville team and community in 2011, and has been teaching professionally since 2014. Phil teaches at many schools and festivals around Asheville, as well as weekly by donation at Carrier Park on Sundays, and travels to national events to compete numerous times throughout the year. His goal is to travel the world with The Wandering Swordsmen to help professionalize the sport, while using his training methods to teach people how to engage in compassionate combat, and by doing so help humanity learn how to resolve conflict more effectively.
